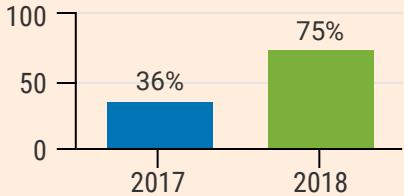

HOW DO STAFFING SHORTAGES AFFECT HEALTH AND SAFETY OF WORKERS?

95% of respondents reported that their organization has a staffing shortage. What is the impact?

- 80% Tired staff
- 75% Rushing practices
- 68% Physical and mental health
- 40% No time to access health and safety resources
- 33% No time to ask co-worker for help



40 PER CENT

of respondents said they didn't receive health and safety training during their post-secondary school program, or weren't sure.
